### **FEAST OF ST. BLASÉ:**

On February 3rd, we celebrate the Feast of St. Blasé who is the patron saint of throat ailments. Legend has told us that Blasé was a bishop who was forced to flee to the back country to escape persecution. There he lived in solitude and prayer making friends with the wild animals. He was found in his cave by a group of hunters who were looking for wild animals. Blasé was kneeling in prayer surrounded by wolves, lions, and bear. As the hunters hauled Blasé off to prison, a mother came to him with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At the command of Blasé, the boy was able to cough the bone out.

Although the details of the story may be sketchy, Blasé is seen as an example of the power those have who give themselves entirely to Jesus. In Jesus' words, “if you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you (John 15:7).

“Through the intercession of St. Blase, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and every other evil. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen” (Blessing of St. Blasé)
