WORDS FROM WORSHIPMINISTRY:

Although he once persecuted the Church, Paul has been blessed with the mission of handing on his faith.

Paul's entire life can be explained in one experience-meeting Jesus on the road to Damascus. In an instant he saw that all the zeal of his dynamic personality was being wasted, like a boxer swinging wildly. He was zealously harassing the men and women of the early church, "entering house after house and dragging out men and women, he handed them over for imprisonment. (Acts 8:3b)." Now he himself was "entered," possessed, all his energy harnessed to one goal-being a slave to Christ in the ministry of reconciliations, and instrument to help others experience the one Savior.

Paul's life became a tireless proclaiming and living out the message of the cross: Christians die to sin in baptism and are buried with Christ; they are dead to all that is sinful and unredeemed in the world. They are made into a new creation, already sharing Christ's victory and someday to rise from the dead like him. Through this risen Christ, the Father pours out the Spirit on them making them completely new. May we, like St. Paul, become a slave to Christ, live the message of the cross, experience renewal by the Holy Spirit and pass on our faith.
