Thirteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

THE TUNNELS OF SAN ANTONIO

In 1921 the city of San Antonio was devastated by floods. Eighty San Antonians were killed when days of heavy rain overwhelmed the 36-square-mile Olmos Basin that drains into the San Antonio River. Over the next dozen years, a series of dams and canals were constructed to control rising flood waters.

In the 1990s, city planners realized that the system could no longer protect a city that had quickly grown. Something had to be done or else the next major "historic" flood would destroy San Antonio. So they developed a plan to build two tunnels underneath the city. The scale of the planned tunnels was mindboggling: 24 feet wide, three miles long, 150 feet below ground. The tunnels would carry flood waters underneath the city and discharge it into river on the other side of San Antonio. The price tag was \$111 million — a financial investment that many city leaders did not support.

But the project went forward and was completed in early 1998. That October, another "once-in-a-millennium" flood hit San Antonio. Over 16 inches of rain fell in the span of a few days. Yet, when city planners made their way to the downtown riverwalk, they saw people sitting at outdoor cafes, walking their dogs and shopping. What happened? The tunnels underneath the city worked. They paid for themselves ten times over.

Again, in 2002, San Antonio had 16 inches of rain in just a few days — and again the tunnels held.

"Prophetic" faith begins in letting go of our own wants and expectations for the sake of realizing God's kingdom here and now, devoting every opportunity and resource and talent we have to making the love of God a reality in every life we touch.

As we gather around the altar for Holy Mass today, we pray on this Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, also a holiday week in which we will celebrate Independence Day. On this holiday we offer a prayer that God will continue to guide and bless our land, that his mercy be upon us so that we can hold the values and morals that this country has held dear from generation to generation. **May God Bless America!**

As festival time inches closer and closer you can help out in so many different ways if you can't work the festival in person. So many bake cakes or desserts, bring in baskets for the Basket Auction and the Children's Basket Auction. Some give cash donations to help with the cost of items. Some come and help during set-up or tear-down. This is our biggest fundraiser of the year, and a fun-raiser as well, when we all come together, work together for the good of our parish community.

Work inside the church building is progressing. As you may have noticed the terrazzo floor in the church is in the

process of being ground down and treated as it is restored to the beauty it had the day the church opened. The kitchen in the church hall continues to be rebuilt. Ovens, convection ovens and fryers have all been installed. The sprinkler system throughout the building has been installed. Waterproofing for the elevator pit is underway. Cabinets have been installed in the sacristy.

You know when you are on a trip and the children keep asking, "Are we there yet?" I feel like I keep saying we are almost there, we are almost there. It's been quite a journey for all of us and we are almost there. Our future is a future full of Hope and Joy awaiting the day we will **gather around the table** in our restored church.
