

AROUND THE TABLE

"VIOLINS OF HOPE"

Amnon Weinstein and his son Avshalom are master violin makers. Two decades ago, a man came to the Weinsteins with an old violin that he wanted repaired for his grandchild. The man explained that he had played the violin when he was being held in a Nazi concentration camp during the Holocaust. When Amnon opened the violin, he found black powder inside — ash from the camp's crematorium. That violin was the beginning of "Violins of Hope," a collection of 70 restored string instruments that the Weinsteins have lovingly repaired and restored that were played by Jewish musicians before and during the Holocaust. They've also been able to preserve many of the stories behind the instruments. Among them:

- A violin made by the famous Dutch Jewish violin maker Jacob Hakkert who died at Auschwitz in 1944.
- A violin owned by an Italian woman who was sent to Auschwitz. Her son managed to take the violin with him to a
 labor camp where he would play it at night with frozen fingers. After the war, he studied engineering and went on to
 build ships to transport and settle Jews in Palestine. After his death in 2012, his widow and daughters gave the
 instrument to Violins for Hope.
- The violin owned by Erich Weininger, a butcher in Vienna as well as an amateur violinist. Though not allowed to play in the camps, he, too, managed to hold on to his instrument. Weininger survived imprisonment at Dachau and Buchenwald. After the war, he settled in Palestine where he played in a small orchestra with other deportees.
- Another instrument survived a heartbreaking journey. In 1942, a train transporting Jews from Paris to concentration camps in the East stopped along a road. A man heard workmen speaking French. The man cried out, "In the place I now go I don't need a violin. Here, take my violin so it may live!" The man threw his violin out the railcar's narrow window and one of the workers picked it up. Years later the instrument was found in an attic and given to Violins for Hope.

The collection travels around the world where the instruments are played in concerts — many are played by the descendants of victims and survivors of the Holocaust. There are also exhibits and educational programs on the history of the Holocaust told through the stories of these instruments. A student in Chicago whose great grandparents were Holocaust survivors played one of the violins. "It was definitely an emotional experience," she said. "As I was playing, I thought of all the people who came before me."

The work of Violins of Hope preserves the memory and dignity of those who endured the horror of the Holocaust. The instruments preserved by the Weinsteins should inspire our world with hope that the "music" of God's Spirit of peace and justice will not be silenced by the merchants of hate and violence. Jesus' encounter with the Canaanite woman is a sign of that same hope, challenging us to transform our own perspective of those we dismiss as less than we are because of their culture, language, gender or faith. May our eyes and spirits be open to see every man, woman and child as God sees them: as God's beloved children, brothers and sisters to one another, all made in the image of God, all embraced within the heart of God.

As we continue to re-group after our festival and take a breath to the next event, we have received so many phone calls, texts and messages about the wonderful time so many families and individuals had at our parish festival. **Again, to God be the glory.** A full report will be given in the next few weeks.

We are blessed with true, dedicated men, with their wives and families who serve the Church and our parish with deep faith and joy. May God continue to bless them with health and happiness. Also, I take this opportunity to ask for prayers for Mr. Kirk Wells as he continues his formation process for the diaconate. May God bless him, his wife, Therese, and family.

A big thank you on behalf of the children at St. Joseph the Provider
School, who will benefit from the school supplies you have so generously donated. I pray that God will bless you for your kindness and generosity.









DEACON JOHN'S STEWARDSHIP COLUMN

EDCHOICE SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR K-12 STUDENTS SEEKING CATHOLIC SCHOOL EDUCATION

Students can qualify for partial or full tuition assistance, based on family income.

The Diocese of Youngstown's Office of Catholic Schools is pleased to announce that **EdChoice** Scholarships are now applicable to Catholic school tuition, as a result of Ohio House Bill 33, which was signed into law on July 4, 2023. <u>All K-12 students in Ohio are eligible to apply for **EdChoice** Scholarships, beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.</u>

Mary Fiala, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Youngstown, comments, "We are excited for this opportunity for our current families as well as for new families, who may have considered a Catholic education before but felt that it was out of their financial reach. As we have always done, we welcome Catholic families as well as any family who desires a faith-filled environment for their family."

EdChoice Scholarships can cover a portion, or in some cases, the full cost of a student's Catholic school tuition, based on their family's 2022 gross adjusted income and family size. Scholarships can be as high as \$6,165 per school year for students in grades K-8 and \$8,407 per year for students in grades 9-12. Prospective Catholic school students and those who are already enrolled in a Catholic school are both eligible to apply for EdChoice Scholarships. Families who are interested in pursuing a Catholic education for their children should contact the principal at the school of their choice to inquire about availability for new enrollments or to learn more about how to apply. Parents and students can find more EdChoice Scholarship information on the diocesan Office of Catholic Schools' website (doy.org/edchoice/), as well as the website for the Ohio. Department of Education.
