THE BROTHERHOOD OF THE OFFENSIVE LINE

Zack Conti is a senior at Eastern Michigan University and an offensive lineman on the school's football team. He's worked multiple jobs to stay in school and play football — his passion. Zack joined the team as a "walk-on" in 2019, which means he's not on scholarship. Zack has worked landscaping, ripped out carpets and did demo work to stay in school. It's been a grind. In addition, Zack and his family have been dealing with a medical crisis: his mom, Karen, suffers from polycystic kidney disease and is awaiting a transplant.

Żack's hard work and commitment did not go unnoticed by his coaches and teammates. The NCAA allows the team to give out 85 scholarships a year. Head Coach Chris Creighton asked for an 86th scholarship but was refused. Tuition at Eastern Michigan is \$7,000 a semester. When teammate and fellow lineman Brian Dooley heard Zack was considering quitting football this season, Brian talked it over with his family. He then walked into head coach Chris Creighton's office and told him he wanted to give his scholarship to Zack. "I've never heard, I've never seen anything like that before," was all the head coach could say of such generosity.

Why did Brian Dooley give up his scholarship? "I did it because I've seen [Zach] grow over the years," Dooley says. "He works hard and gets extra work with me all the time. In my eyes, he's earned it 100%. Giving up my scholarship so he can stay means everything. I'm proud of what he has become and cannot wait to see what he does on the field. The 'o' [offensive]-line brotherhood is hard to break. We have each other's back."

Brian's generous response mirrors the vision that Christ calls us to embrace in the parable of the sheep and the goats — a vision that realizes the holiness of God within every man, woman and child; a vision of humanity that sees deeper than the externals of social and economic status, race, nationality, culture and language to behold the life of God animating the lives of all who draw breath; a vision that, once realized, changes not only those we are able to assist but ourselves, as well.

Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King of the Universe, Christ the Shepherd—King of today's Gospel identifies Himself with the poor, the hurting, lost or forgotten. That is our call and our commandment. As we celebrate this great feast and recognize Jesus in our midst, our prayer is that we be conformed into His image so that

the least of our sisters and brothers will see the face and hands of Jesus as we live with, work with, and minister to them. Many times those in need are closer than we think.

Thanks to all who prepared the loaves of bread for our Thanksgiving Mass. It's a beautiful tradition that we started and now continues.

Next week will begin the season of Advent. With thanksgiving to God, let us enter the beauty of this upcoming season as we make ready our celebration of the Nativity of the Lord and a New Year.

DEACON JOHN'S STEWARDSHIP COLUMN



I am a teacher at St Rose School in Girard, and am blessed to be able to teach religion to 6th and 7th graders this year. New to us this school year, we began to use a Virtues in Practice Program which was created by the Dominican Sisters of St Cecelia Congregation of Nashville, Tennessee. Each month, we focus on a particular virtue and teach that virtue as we also learn about saints and how they lived their holy lives. The virtue for this month of November is Stewardship. I immediately thought about this column in our bulletin each week and how Deacon John highlights the stewardship of our community here at St Pat's and beyond. I used this column as an example to my students and after just one lesson on stewardship I asked them to tell me what it meant in their own words. They replied with... <u>Stewardship is</u> "Giving back to God what He gave to us" "Thanking God for all that He has done for us" "We need to be stewards of the earth" "Helping the world and all God's people" "Giving donations to the homeless shelter" "Being selfless" "Taking time out of your day to make others happy" "Showing everyone that you are a child of God and you can help anyone in need".

These answers made me very proud and also allowed me to grow in my faith and gain confidence in these young stewards.

One of the main goals of the program is to help children grow closer to Jesus by imitating the virtues of the saints. I think we are on our way to achieving that goal.


