## AROUND THE TABLE

First Sunday of Advent



Dear Friends.

"Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come." -Mark 13: 33-37

#### **GRACE ON THE DARKEST OF DAYS**

Lewiston is a close-knit community of 36,000 located between Augusta and Portland, Maine. The city was devastated last October 25 when a gunman killed 18 in a shooting spree, first, in a bowling alley and then a nearby tavern. The victims ranged in age from a 14-year-old boy and his dad who were bowling together to a couple in their seventies who died protecting children from the shooter.

One of the victims was Joseph Walker, the popular manager of Schemengees Bar and Grille. When the gunman entered the tavern with his automatic weapon, Walker went after him with a butcher knife to try to stop him, but Walker was immediately shot and killed. He was 57, a father and grandfather.

The following day, Joseph Walker's father, Leroy Walker, spoke to CNN. In the emotional interview, Leroy Walker said that despite his pain, he could not bring himself to hate the shooter. Visibly emotional, Leroy Walker explained: "If the person was, at the time, in his right mind, I believe he would have been a loving person just like we are. I just can't hate him . . . You can't run around this world hating people. If you do, these kinds of things will happen more and more. . . if you hate and the hate drives you crazy, you're going to hurt people . . . And I'm sure this man, whatever happened to his mind, I'm sure he wasn't born to be a killer, and I'm sure his father and mother would have never believed this would have happened with him. So all I can say is I'm sorry that it's happened to all of us, and I'm sorry what may happen to him. And God will prevail. Hate will never bring my son back."

On this First Sunday of Advent, Jesus urges us to be "alert" and "watch" for the love of God in our midst. Sometimes the darkness of despair and hurt makes it difficult to see that love, but the Walker family of Lewiston possesses that awareness, that "alertness" to God's movement and presence even in life's most devastating moments. Advent calls us to "watch," to be "alert" to the presence of God in the love of family and friends, in moments of crisis and despair, in every challenge and opportunity we have to bring that presence "to birth" in our own acts of compassion, forgiveness and generosity.

The past few weekends ending with Christ the King have given us the opportunity to reflect in thankfulness. As we hear in the scripture, "in all things be thankful". Many have gone through very difficult times this past year,

from mourning the death of someone close to us, to a sickness. Perhaps our family is broken up or just drifted far apart. There always seems to be trouble at work or if we are a young adult, are faced with decisions and situations no child should have to be in. What we are thankful for is that God is right beside us. Jesus reminds us not to be afraid. As we begin a new church or liturgical year, we are told to be watchful and alert. Don't let the



darkness of a changing world or the hopelessness and despair which comes our way, keep us from listening to Jesus saying, "don't be afraid". Be watchful and alert so you can hear His voice in your life and His hand guiding you.

If you didn't see the Reader's Choice winners edition of the Tribune/Vindicator, St. Patrick Roman Catholic Church's annual summer festival was voted a Bronze award, truly an honor.

This week our Trumbull Deanery will gather at Blessed Sacrament Church in Warren for an **Advent Reconciliation Service on Tuesday, December 5 at 7:00 pm**. All are welcome.

Vince Ambrosetti called me on Thanksgiving Day to let all of us know we have a special place in his heart. He is planning on coming to St. Patrick's in March for a Lenten mission. Details will be coming soon.

You will notice our Advent liturgy or celebration of Holy Mass will take on a spirit of waiting and patience. Think of all our parishioners waiting for important transitions in their lives and that of their family. As we celebrate Advent, we anticipate the arrival (Latin word, *aventus* meaning an approach, arrival) of Jesus, not only in His birth in time on Christmas, but also as King Eternal at the end of time. Be watchful and alert, Jesus is present here at Mass in the Eucharist, the proclamation of the Gospel and in the spirit of the Church ministering to one another.




