

AROUND THE TABLE

Very Rev. Michael A. Swierz, Pastor Thirtieth Sunday In Ordinary Time



Dear Friends,

As we turn the page on yet another month, we gather together in a spirit of thankfulness and commitment to our faith. As our youngsters prepare for trick-or-treat, we prepare to celebrate the Festival of All Saints on Wednesday, November 1. It is a holy day of obligation and Masses will be celebrated at 8:30 am and 7:00 pm. The Solemnity of All Saints celebrates those who have committed themselves to Christ and striven to be like him. It includes all who are living and all "who have gone before us with the sign of faith" (Eucharistic Prayer I). In a more restrictive sense, it refers to those whom the Church names as saints and all those unnamed who are with the Lord. We publicly commit ourselves to Christ at our baptism and join a community that strives to follow Christ in all things. Therefore, as we celebrate all those who are with God already, our hope is that we too, by being faithful to our baptismal call, may one day join them in complete union with God.

On Thursday, we will celebrate All Souls Day, a day we remember and pray for all those who have died. We do not know for certain what happens after death, but we live in hope of eternal union with our loving God, who initiates a relationship with us at our birth and continually invites us to respond. How we respond to God in our lifetime will determine if our life beyond death will be in union with God or separate from God. Thus, we believe that our love relationship with God endures for all eternity, with God always ready to welcome and embrace us. We also believe that death does not separate the living from those who have died. Just as we ask each other for prayers during our lifetime, we continue that practice even beyond death. Perhaps you could visit a cemetery and remember a loved one by lighting a candle for them. You will see the Book of Remembrance out in church. You can write the names of your deceased loved ones in the book and we will pray for them all during the month of November.

At 7:00 pm on **All Souls Day**, we will remember all of those men and women and children from our parish and families who died this past year. A candle will be given to those present who lost a loved one to take home and use it in prayer or family gatherings during the upcoming holidays.

Our first Wine Mixer, held outside last Thursday was great. There were so many positive comments, and folks can't wait for another one. Thanks to our staff and all who made this event a first class success. Special thanks to Monica and Mike Zappa from the Gatehouse Winery in Jamestown, PA and Nate and Dani Wilson from the Woodland Cellars Winery here in Hubbard.

Our small focus groups on the Holy Eucharist have been so informative and enlightening for those who attend. As we spend this year with our brothers and sisters remembering that the Holy Eucharist we share is truly the body and blood of our Lord, may we say with conviction, devotion and love, *O Sacrament most Holy, O Sacrament Divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine.*



CATHOLIC CONFENECE OF OHIO ON 2023 NOVEMBER BALLOT ISSUES 1 AND 2

The Catholic Conference of Ohio firmly opposes Issue 1, which would enshrine the "right" to abortion in the Ohio

Constitution. This extreme amendment endangers the health and safety of women, threatens parental rights, and allows for abortion through all nine months of pregnancy.

society, including the indigent, migrants, and preborn children in the womb. We will continue to do so by explaining the harms Issue 1 poses to women, parents, and babies with Catholics and all people of goodwill across Ohio and encourage a no vote on this egregious proposal. Ohioans deserve just laws which provide expansive resources and accompaniment to mothers and young families, not proposals like Issue 1 which does nothing to support women.

The Catholic Conference of Ohio also opposes Issue 2 to legalize recreational marijuana in Ohio.

Ohio's election is on Tuesday, Nov. 7 and you are encouraged to be informed on the ballot issues.
