

# AROUND THE TABLE

Very Rev. Michael A. Swierz, Pastor Twenty-Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time



Dear Friends,

#### "WITH A LOT OF HELP FROM MY FRIENDS . . . "

Three summers ago, Boston editor and writer Carlin Carr was diagnosed with breast cancer. Ahead of her was a summer of 50 radiation treatments over seven months. The pandemic forced the hospital to enact a strict "no visitors" policy. Cancer is isolating at any time, but COVID-19 brought isolation to a whole new level. So Carlin got creative. She made a spreadsheet with her Monday-through-Friday appointments and asked family and friends if they would walk with her from her apartment to Massachusetts General Hospital. The slots filled up quickly: her first boss from 20 years ago came up from Connecticut to walk with Carlin during a thunderstorm; a friend of Minneapolis traveled halfway across the country; a neighbor, a woman from Pakistan Carlin had never properly conversed with before, joined her one day in the midsummer heat. Carlin's loved ones were delighted to join her for the five-mile roundtrip trek.

The radiation left her exhausted; in addition, this was one of the hottest summers in recent years in Boston. But each day another person in sneakers and water showed up at her door. Carlin felt motivated and excited every day. "Walking gave me strength, purpose and a connection during this most isolating of experiences," Carlin says. "Before heading into my appointment, I handed off the guest book — a teal leatherbound notebook — that I asked each person to sign, recording memories of our walk as well as their favorite songs to add to my 'Walk with Me' playlist."

Two of Carlin's best friends joined her for the last walk on Day 50. Carlin's radiation oncologist met them for the final stretch. What might have been a long, difficult, discouraging summer, Carlin writes, "was not dominated by cancer, despite the hours we trekked to rid my body of it. What I'll remember most is long walks and long conversations — and the lengths people will go to show up when you need them most."

Carlin has established the "Walk With Me Project" to support other cancer patients through their treatment and help them activate their support communities during their journeys. [The Boston Globe, July 29, 2021; WCVB-TV, August 18, 2022.]

The kingdom of God that Jesus proclaims is centered in a sense of gratitude for what we have received and the humility to seek to share those blessings with others. And in that spirit of gratitude, we discover the happiness that is of God. Despite the challenges of her cancer treatments, Carlin Carr found reason for hope and gratitude in the support of family and friends who walked with her during this difficult time in her life. In their accompaniment, she was able to transcend resentment and hopelessness to maintain a positive attitude of hope and joy because of their unconditional support and presence. Today's Gospel calls us to a change of perspective in the way we see and live our lives. Jesus calls us to look beyond what we do not have and realize and rejoice in the good we possess: the love of family and friends, opportunities to learn and grow, the freedom and resources to live lives of fulfillment and meaning.

As we gather together as a parish family, we come together with a spirit of gratitude for all that God has done for us. We see the cornstalks, pumpkins and fall decorations. The leaves on the trees are beginning to change their

color. Soon we will be in a season of thanksgiving. However every time we gather around the table, we give thanks to the Lord, "from whom all blessings flow". As we pray Holy Mass today, let us stand before the Lord with a thankful heart for His presence in our lives.

It was with a heavy heart that we learned of Sr. Bernadine's retirement from our parish community and the ministry she lived here among us. Sr. Bernadine brought a calming peace to our families who were mourning the death of a loved one. She brought a deep sense of prayer to our families who had to go through and understand the Funeral Rite and liturgy. Most of all her love and compassion is the gift she leaves with us. Even though we will see her again and her friendship continues, her absence will be felt. On behalf of all of us, especially the parish staff, I want to thank Sr. Bernadine for all she has been to St. Patrick Parish. And we pray God will keep her in good health in mind, soul, and body for many years to come. Sr. Bernadine will be back in town for our All Souls Day Mass when we remember our beloved dead, especially those who have died this past year. Sister will also be making the Annual Religious Retirement Appeal for us. We will have a reception for her at a later time in our newly remodeled church hall!



As our Sunday morning PSR classes resume, please be careful as you leave 8:30 am Mass. The parents are dropping off their children, who are entering the school building. So be aware it can be a little hectic until we have all of the parking lots in use.

#### JESUS AND THE EUCHARIST STUDY


