

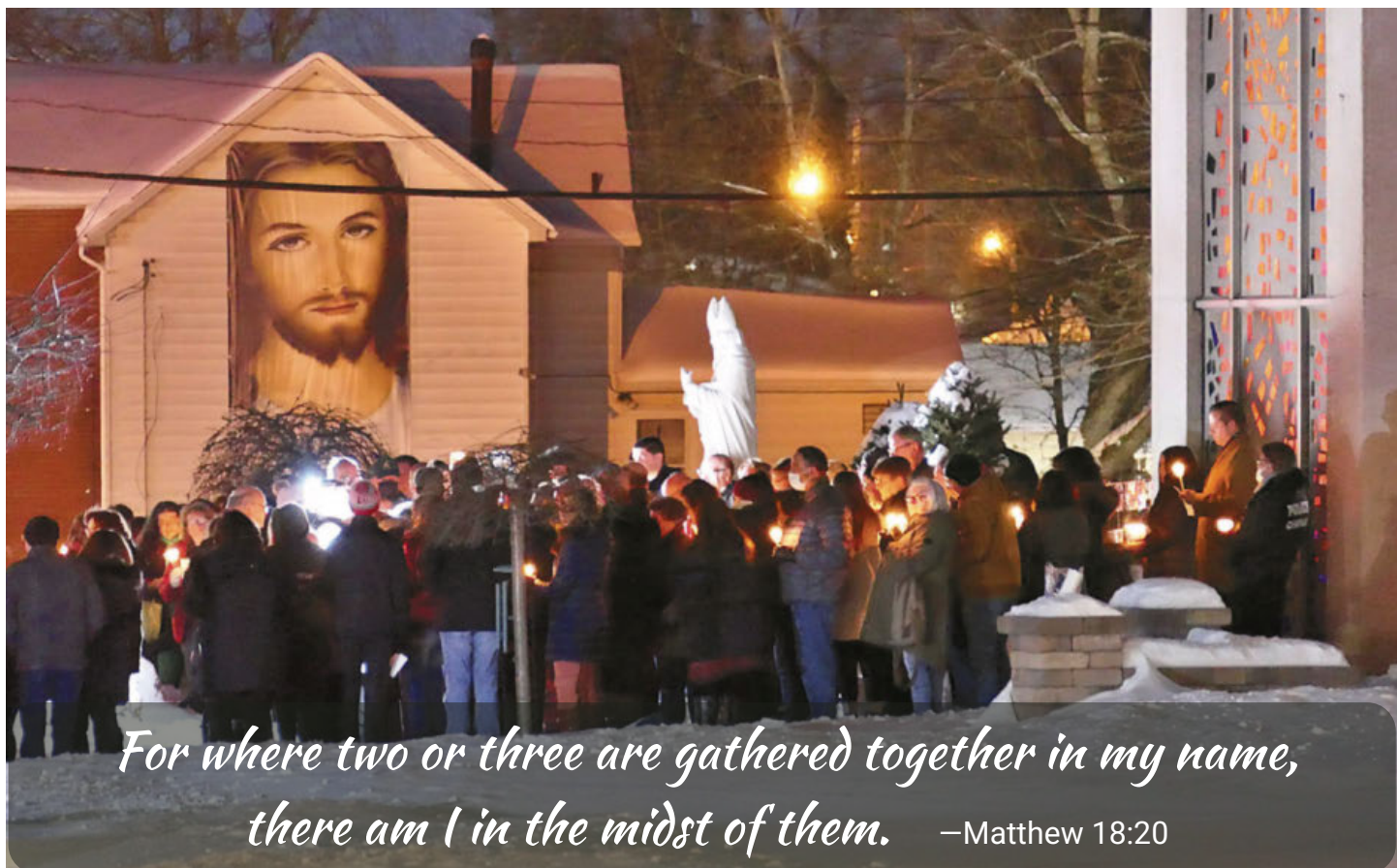

Twenty-Third Sunday In Ordinary Time



Dear Friends,

The Gospel reading today ends with the words "Where two or three are gathered together in my name there I am in the midst of them." These words remind us that **where the Church gathers, Jesus is present**. Page through this week's bulletin and think about what you see. The front cover has the people of our parish gathering on the first anniversary of the fire that disrupted our lives. But, as you know, the Church still gathers. We see ministries are alive here in our parish, folks who gather to bring Christ's presence to the larger community: ministers such as our altar servers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, greeters, ushers and food pantry workers, and we know **Jesus is in our midst**. Our catechists gather and prepare to teach our young and share the Good News and we recognize **Jesus in our midst**.

In our prayer life and our social life, as we gather as Church, **Jesus is here in our midst**. Don't miss the opportunity you and your family have to experience His love, mercy and joy, for **Jesus is in our midst**.

Our first experience of Jesus and His presence is in the Holy Eucharist. We will never be as close as we are to heaven until the day we stand before the Lord, as we are when we hold Jesus or partake of Holy Communion. Jesus said, "I am the living Bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever. The bread that I give is my flesh for the life of the world." —John 6:51. Do you believe that Jesus is truly present in the Holy Eucharist? This year, the National Eucharistic Revival invites all of us to a greater respect, love and appreciation of the Most Blessed Sacrament. We will engage in small group sessions and there will be opportunities provided by Mrs. Karen Bartos for parents and parishioners centering on the Holy Eucharist. We will look at the Holy Eucharist and our story and how Jesus is revealed in the Scripture, answering the question, "Who do people say that I am?" We will look at how we encounter Jesus through the Church, the sacraments and on our journey. This is an exciting time for us, especially as we prepare to re-enter our church building, our beloved worship space.

As we gather this weekend, we pray a special prayer for all grandparents, that God will bless all of you with health and happiness and thank God for you on this **Grandparents Day**.

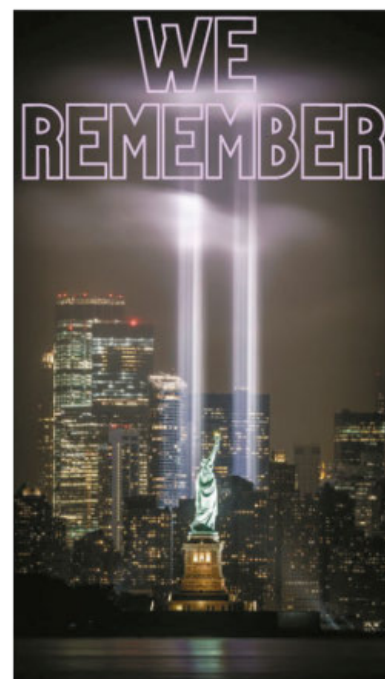

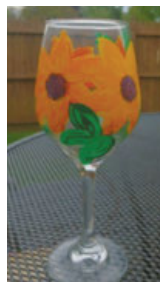


ALTAR AND ROSARY GIFT CARD RAFFLE
